JOHN'S STORY

For John, a cancer patient at Lakeridge Health, the arrival of Durham Region's first PET-CT scanner could not have come at a better time.

"Dr. Schattner and I knew PET-CT was coming," John said. "We were waiting for this."

Like many patients in our community, John's entire cancer treatment has taken place at Lakeridge Health Oshawa, but he has travelled out-of-town for two PET-CT scans. Until now, the closest two scanners were in Toronto and Ottawa.

"We're a one-car family, so it takes a lot of planning," he explained. "Typically my wife drops me off at work and heads to Port Perry. When I go to Toronto for scans, she takes the day off to take me there. We have to figure out childcare too. It's a whole day thing."

During a recent test, John's Oncologist, Dr. Ariah Schattner, noticed some inflammation. Investigating it would require another PET-CT scan. Thanks to the recent outpouring of donor support, commuting for care would no longer be a problem.

"I live five minutes from the Oshawa hospital," John said. "The idea that I could come here and get this scan was amazing." Thanks to *Our Cancer Campaign*, Lakeridge Health officially unveiled the scanner at the beginning of November 2024. John's scan was booked for December.

He was able to see his results on Christmas Eve and learned that the swelling had gone down.

"It's a lot easier to wake up in the morning knowing you don't have to sit in traffic," John laughed. "I was back home having a coffee before noon."

"My care was great before. Now that I can get scans here it's even better. It's everything in one space; I don't have to go anywhere else."

SPOTLIGHT: PET-CT



Ground-Breaking Technology Arrives in Oshawa

Durham Region's first-ever PET-CT scanner has arrived at Lakeridge Health Oshawa, bringing essential diagnostic imaging options closer to home than ever before.

PET-CT, or Positron Emission Tomography (PET) with Computerized Tomography (CT), allows for detailed, three-dimensional scans that can easily detect unusual or abnormal activity happening at the cellular level.

These scans are a vital tool in diagnosing cancer and may also be used to evaluate the function of organs, such as the brain or heart, and other tissues for the presence of disease or other conditions. For many

patients, a PET-CT scan is an essential part of a cancer treatment plan.

Thanks to our donors, \$2.17 million was raised through *Our Cancer Campaign* and granted to Lakeridge Health for the project. These funds, along with \$2.74 million from the Government of Ontario, Ontario Health, and Cancer Care Ontario allowed for the purchase of PET-CT equipment and renovations to outfit its new home in the Nuclear Medicine department.

The arrival of PET-CT technology in Durham Region makes an incredible impact on the well-being of patients and families, some who will no longer have to commute as far as Toronto or Ottawa for access to lifesaving diagnostic imaging services.

Currently, there are only 16 PET-CT machines across Ontario, and many expert staff at Lakeridge Health have been advocating to bring this

technology to the Region for years. The purchase of this equipment has been a special milestone for Lakeridge Health staff and patients alike.

It is anticipated that the scanner will support 1,000 patients in its first year, with volumes of scans increasing gradually thereafter.

The arrival of PET-CT at our Oshawa Hospital is a true testament to the generosity of our donor community.

"We extend our deepest appreciation to all who contributed to this vital project," says Yves Gadler, CEO, Lakeridge Health Foundation. "Bringing PET-CT to Lakeridge Health was one of the major innovations made possible by generous donors to *Our Cancer Campaign* and represents our community's dedication to advancing cancer services and ensuring exceptional health care is available close to home."
